Cuprum font family for LATEX

1 Introduction

The Cuprum font family has been published by the Free Fonts Project some years ago, with more than other 50 free fonts and families, thanks to active collaboration with a large number of designers.

These fonts can be seen all over the world, and in particular Cuprum is extensively used by University of Padua in some of its sub-websites. So I decided to make this small package to be used with $\[Mathbb{E}T_EX]$ (thus without the need of X= $\[Mathbb{E}T_EX]$ or Lual $\[Mathbb{E}T_EX]$).

The fonts are redistributed under their original license (SIL Open Font License, Version 1.1).

2 Installation

- 1. Copy the contents of the subdirectories:
 - doc in texmf/doc/latex/cuprum
 - map in texmf/fonts/map/dvips/cuprum
 - tex in texmf/tex/latex/cuprum
 - tfm in texmf/fonts/tfm/cuprum
 - ttf in texmf/fonts/truetype/public/cuprum.

2. Add the line

Map cuprum.map

at the end of the file <code>updmap.cfg</code> in your distribution. Under MikTeX, this should be done by typing the command

initexmf --edit-config-file updmap

in the console.

- 3. Refresh the databases by using these commands:
 - mktexlsr to rebuild the list of files located in your texmf tree;
 - updmap-sys to rebuild the map files.

3 Usage

Make sure to include the fontenc package with T1 encoding:

```
\usepackage[T1]{fontenc}
```

Then, you can use the font family either locally, with

```
{\fontfamily{cpr}\selectfont some text}
```

or globally, loading the package cuprum:

```
\usepackage{cuprum}
```
